

Anyone under 18 that's not traveling with both of their parents needs to have an international letter of consent signed by parents and have it notarized. Even if one parent will be travelling with the minor, the Letter of Consent needs to be signed by the other parent.

Once you do this please send us a copy. You wouldn't actually sign it until you are with a notary. Usually your bank will have a notary and provide this service free to their costumers.
